#### NEWS FROM PARISH COUNCIL

#### February 2017

The council met with representatives of Blennerhasset and Torpenhow Parish Council to exchange views on the future of Blennerhasset and Baggrow Playing Field. Repairs had been carried out to the Watch hill noticeboard. Two vacancies remained on the parish council. The Council agreed to donate £50 to the Wigton Bath Trust. A letter had been received from the Chair of Allhallows Community Centre Management Committee giving an update on the work of that group. Dog fouling remains a problem in Fletchertown and the Borough Council are investigating. Most of the Allotment rents had now been received.

#### March 2017

The council have responded to the Allerdale Local Plan (Part2): Site Allocations asking that an area of land at South Street, Fletchertown be taken out of the proposal for development because it would add to the congestion in the village and the additional traffic through the village and dangerous crossroads. The council also responded to the Boundary Commission proposal that Allhallows should form a new Allerdale Ward with Waverton and Newton Arlosh on grounds that there is nothing in common with these parishes and the geographical area is far too large for one councillor. A risk assessment for the council's work was produced and the effectiveness of the internal audit was considered

#### April 2017

Several highway defects were brought to the attention of the council which have been passed to Cumbria County Council to deal with. There is to be a Flood Recovery Workshop to be held at Rheged, Penrith between 9.30am and 1600 on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April 2017. The council agreed to support the Farmers Flood Group. They also completed the annual governance statement and approved the annual accounts which will now go to the internal auditor and then the external auditor. The next meeting will be on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May starting with the Annual Parish Meeting at 7pm in the Allhallows Centre which will be followed by the Annual Parish Council Meeting
